ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE: Advent should not be turned into an anticipated Christmas. It runs into Christmas, certainly, and finds its resolution in that feast, and then in the octave and season that follow, in the feasts of Mary, Mother of God, the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord.

Advent is a penitential season, in the sense of being a call to conversion. It necessarily incorporates pain and a sense of lack, the whole of our insufficiency. Advent converts and enlarges us, and does so with our hope. Advent delivers the surprise of the Child in whom all things hold together and God is with us.

There are several opportunities to receive the Sacrament of Confession or Reconciliation during Advent: on Mondays after 10 am Mass, on Saturday at 5.30 pm before the Vigil Mass of

Sunday, in Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church on Wednesdays of Advent from 7.30 pm – 8 pm, and at the **Kilmarnock Parishes Penitential Service on Monday 18th December at 7.00 pm in St Joseph's Church, Kilmarnock.** Please take seriously the invitation to the Sacrament of Penance in preparation for Christmas.

The children who made the sacrament of reconciliation for the first time in Spring 2022 are invited to return to the sacrament at this service on Monday 18th December.

CATHEDRAL SERVICE OF READINGS AND CAROLS FOR CHRISTMAS: A Service of Readings and Carols for Christmas will take place in St Margaret's Cathedral on Wednesday 20th December at 7.30 pm. The service provides an opportunity to come together once again as a diocesan family to celebrate the birth of Our Lord at Christmas. All are welcome.

ST JOSEPH'S ACADEMY CHRISTMAS RAFFLE: Head boy of the junior school and altar server Joseph Davidson would like to thank all the parishioners who supported the raffle. £1200 was raised and it will be used to help families in the school community, struggling with the cost-of-living crisis.

BUFFER ZONE BILL: Gillian Mackay MSP, member for Central Scotland Region, has published a Bill to introduce 'safe access zones', or buffer zones, around abortion centres in Scotland. This 'buffer zone' law being proposed for Scotland will be the most extreme of its kind in the world. The Bill is clear that "praying audibly" and "silent vigils" will be criminalised, punishable by an "unlimited fine". This includes "the actions of a person inside their residential flat that are visible through the window" up to 200 m from an abortion centre. Additionally, the Bill allows for future modifications to extend the 200 m 'buffer zone' to GPs, pharmacies, and counselling services. This Bill means residential homes, Catholic schools, graveyards, churches and mosques will fall into the 200 m 'buffer zone', essentially criminalising prayer. The consultation closes on 20th December, and it is important that as many people as possible respond.
