The next event, hosted by our own deanery, will take place on Saturday 29th March, beginning with Mass at 10.00 am. The day will focus on the theme of: “It’s okay to be holy! - A study day on Lumen Gentium” with different parishes and clusters presenting on different sections of the document, followed by an opportunity to prayer, discernment and discussion in the spirit, following the model of the synod.

**EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE:** When we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, one of the conditions for validity is that we have made a good examination of conscience prior to celebrating the sacrament so that we can truly give an account of ourselves and our sins to God. To help you prepare to celebrate the sacrament, a guided examination of conscience is available to pick up outside both confessional.

During the season of Lent we're encouraged in a particular way to follow Christ more closely – to conform our lives to him – and one of the ways in which we do this especially is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Through our sins, both venial and mortal, we distance ourselves from God – venial is smaller ways, but nonetheless significant; and mortal through which we turn away from God – we are encouraged to be aware of our sinfulness, and, being aware of it, to attend the sacrament regularly but especially during the season of Lent.

**APPEAL FOR CHILDREN'S LITURGY LEADERS:** We are extremely grateful to the committed team of children's liturgy leaders who facilitate children's liturgy each week. As a number of leaders have had to step back in recent months we are looking to recruit more leaders to help us continue providing this invaluable ministry to the young people of our parish. If you would be interested in becoming part of this highly rewarding ministry, please speak to Margaret McGrath for more information.


Included is:

For many centuries, Iona has been an island of special significance for all Christians. In AD 563, Columba and his followers arrived here from Ireland to spread the gospel in Scotland and the north of England. St Oran's Chapel and Reilig Odhran is reputed to be the burial place of 48 kings of Scotland, including Macbeth.

## STEWARDSHIP AND FUNDRAISING

**PARISH STEWARDSHIP:** At the start of February, Fr Stephen issued a booklet about Income/Expenditure for 2024 with an analysis of stewardship and proposals to increase weekly income by £500 per week. An increase in income will be necessary to continue the repair and maintenance work scheduled from previous years (mainly re-pointing of the church and presbytery). The booklet is available from the porch if you didn't get one.

To increase weekly income by £500 (by £25,000 per year) we invite 100 people to increase their weekly donation by £5. Standing Order forms are available from the stall in the porch, or a change can be made using internet banking.

**FUNDRAISING EVENT FOR THE MARTIN CHAMBERS ECUADOR TRUST:** 10th April marks the first anniversary of the death of Fr Martin Chambers. In his memory and to support the Martin Chambers Ecuador Trust, our parishioner Danny Gorman will undertake a challenging 100 km journey on his 26 year-old, 49cc, 2-stroke Vespa moped on Sunday 6th April. Danny describes the route below.

## Outline

The annual Pip Squeak Rally is organised by the Glasgow Section of the Vintage Motor Cycle Club (VMCC). It is a rally for low powered moped and motorcycles under 100cc. The journey is approximately 60 km around country back lanes of Ayrshire where we will encounter rough roads (untarmacked), steep slopes and the occasional water hazard. A stiff test of endurance for both rider and machine. Needless to say, a fair proportion of the participants do not complete the rally. My "trusty steed" is a 26



year old, 49cc, 2-stroke Vespa moped complete with Italian livery. In addition to the actual rally I will travel an extra circa 50 km return trip to the start/finish at Lochwinnoch. A significant proportion of the participants take the opportunity to use the rally as a source of fundraising for various charities. I will take the opportunity to raise funds for the **Martin Chambers Ecuador Trust**.

Accordingly I will start by leaving St Joseph's at 9.00am to commence the **25 km** journey to join the Pip Squeak Rally at the starting point in Lochwinnoch.

**Pip Squeak Rally:** Beginning at Route 760 heading east through Lochwinnoch then a right to Howood. We then take the uphill Switchback (Bowfield Road) to Lochwinnoch past the reservoir on nice wee roads. At Uplawmoor we turn right onto Tannoch road continuing into East Ayrshire through many twists and turns to Dunlop. From Dunlop we head to Lugton on the main road then the Beith Road taking the right turn on the Glennifer Road. We then take first left onto more twisting small roads which eventually brings us downhill to the roundabout approaching the finishing point at Lochwinnoch.

Actual Rally distance **approximately 50 - 60km**.

Assuming I successfully complete the rally (!!!), I will then be required to ride back the **25km journey to Kilmarnock**.

#### **TOTAL DISTANCE - APPROXIMATELY 100 km.**

The Vespa records distance in km. Accordingly I will take photographic records of the odometer at the beginning and the end of the journey.

#### **PASTORAL OUTREACH**

**APPEAL FROM ST VINCENT DE PAUL:** Demand for the Parish foodbank has been increasingly notably over recent weeks at a time when donations of food have also been decreasing. This puts increasing pressure on the society to try and fund purchases of food in order to keep producing food bags for those in need in our community. They ask that, if possible, you please consider donating either full food bags, or individual items. Any donations are greatly appreciated and can be left in the box in the church porch. The contents requested for a food bag are:

- Can of soup
- Canned meal, e.g. beef stew, chilli con carne, curry
- Pasta or rice (only small bags)
- Tinned fruit / vegetables / beans
- Cartons of long-life milk (UHT)
- Tin of tuna
- Packet of biscuits
- Toilet roll.

Please ensure canned foods **have a ring pull** for opening. Please also note that tea, coffee and sugar are **not required**. Any donations are gratefully received and can be dropped off in the Church Porch / Church Hall (Wednesday 10.30 – 11.30) / Church House.
